The 2016 Academy of European Law summer course on the Law of the European Union focused on the theme of the global reach of EU law.

The General Course and six Specialized Courses, taught by prominent scholars in the field, examined the many complex issues relating to the increasingly global reach of EU law. Identifying the ways in which the EU shapes law and regulation beyond its borders in areas including cross-border financial regulation, migration policy, climate change, internet governance and competition law, the courses used topical case studies to examine EU unilateral and bilateral approaches as well as the multilateral dimension of the global reach of EU law.

This Workshop brings together these scholars once more to discuss and debate their draft chapters for the Collected Courses volume that will be published from the courses: *The Global Reach of EU Law*.
